Associate Professorships in Anthropology

The Department of Anthropology at the University of Copenhagen offers two new positions as Associate Professor in Anthropology with a starting date of 1 January 2008.

Associate Professor in the Anthropology of Culture and Economy

The Department of Anthropology plans to strengthen its research and teaching profile within the area of culture and economy, including connections between social values, consumption and production, transitional economies and the relationship between materiality and culture.

Field experience from Asia and/or post-socialist societies will be an advantage.

Associate Professor in the Anthropology of Policy and Organizations

The Department of Anthropology also wants to strengthen its research and teaching profile within the general area of policy and organizations, including the more specific domains of policy formation and the dynamics of bureaucracy, social policy and welfare.

Field experience from Denmark or Europe will be an advantage.

Qualifications and Job Description

For both positions applicants should have a Ph.D or equivalent degree and solid teaching and supervision competence at university level. They must have a background of extensive fieldwork-based research, demonstrating a variety of research methods and forms of analysis.

Associate professorship positions involve research, teaching courses at all levels, supervision of research students, and administration. The successful applicants will be expected to actively promote research in the above areas and are invited to sketch their ideas in the application. They will also teach in their own as well as broader fields of anthropology, and participate in the development of new courses.

Conditions of Employment

Terms of employment are according to the agreement between the Ministry of Finance and the Danish Confederation of Professional Associations (AC). The annual salary as Associate Professor is within the range DDK 365,000-416,000 (Euro 49,000 - 56,000). The salary levels are exclusive of pension contributions. Negotiation for further supplements will be possible. A special 25% tax scheme is offered for up to three years to researchers recruited abroad (please see www.ku.dk/english).

Application and documentation

All applications must include:

- A numbered list of publications. A <u>maximum</u> of 6 publications, which the candidate particularly wishes to have taken into consideration, should be marked with an asterisk (*). For joint research the application must contain statement from the co-author(s) about the applicant?s share of the work.
- A curriculum vitae detailing the candidate?s education, research record, international research cooperation, and experience with research administration, including any experience in coordinating research projects.
- Documentation of teaching experience, including teaching evaluations, supervision activities and pedagogical training during the past five years.
- . A brief (max 5 pages) discussion of current research and a short description of vision plans for own future research and teaching activities.

The University welcomes applications from suitably qualified candidates regardless of age, gender, race, religion or ethnic background.

It should be noted that the Assessment Committee could require supplementary academic documentation for the evaluation. If so, the applicant will be notified.

When the assessment committee has finished its evaluation, each applicant will receive only that part of the committee's assessment relating to him/herself.
